Field Day Plan

- Call Sign: K6KP
- FD Category: 3F SCV EOC activated and operating on 100% emergency power < 150 watts for each station
 - Class F is EOC designation
 - See Section 4.8 of the ARRL 2013 Field Day packet
- Location:
 - Between City Hall and Library on Torre Ave.
- Operating Stations
 - Three HF Stations
 - Bands: 40m, 20m, 15m, 10m
 - Modes: CW, Phone (PSK31 will be available)
 - GOTA station WA2KDX
 - One VHF/UHF Station
 - Modes: FM Voice, Packet?
 - One ATV Station

- 100ft Coax for HF stations and VHF / UHF station
- Com Van Vertical HF antenna
- Radios: IC-7000 and CARES 2m Kenwood, ComVan IC-7000
- Logging: laptop with logging software
 - Paper logs can also be used
 - GOTA station log sheet
- Site
- Two 2KW generators, gas, 2 power strips, extension cords
- Fire extinguishers from ARK

Cupertino 4th of July Fireworks!

- The City of Cupertino Parks and Recreation Department is putting on a Fourth of July fireworks show for the residents of Cupertino.
- The fireworks will be launched from the Cupertino High School baseball field.
- Viewing venues are set up at Hyde Junior High, Creekside Park, and Sedgewick Elementary School.
- No spectators will be allowed on the High School grounds.
- Unofficial viewing site will develop at the vacant lot on the north side of Stevens
 Creek between Finch and Tantau.
- Except for handicapped persons, and event staff, there will be no parking at the venues.
- Public parking will be available at the parking structure at Cupertino Square.
- Cupertino Amateur Radio Emergency Service (CARES), Cupertino Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), and Cupertino Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) have been asked to provide support for the event.



Field Operations, Perimeter Positions

Command Post

- Co-located with the Sheriff Office (SO) Command Post.
- Liaison to County Sheriff.
- Net Control station.
- Co-ordination of all CARES/CERT/MRC activities.

Cupertino High Schools

- Teams to provide "eyes and ears" for SO.
- Perimeter security for high school.
- Fire watch for neighboring houses.
- 5 fixed posts, 2 roving teams. Teams to rotate

Street Closures

- Teams to provide "eyes and ears" for SO.
- Provide information to citizens on event location and routes.

Rover

Assist SO foot patrol.





What to bring

Cupertino 4th of July Fireworks!

All participants must come with the following...

- Fluorescent Orange or Fluorescent Green Vest
- DSW Card
- Drivers License
- Clothing appropriate for the weather
- Closed-toe shoes or boots
- Water and food (you will be in the field for 6 hours)
- Flashlight with spare batteries
- Clip-board, paper, pen or pencil
- Whistle

All Ham Radio operator must have the following additional equipment...

- HTs. Set up for CARES TAC-1, TAC-2, and TAC-3
- Battery power for a minimum of five hours of operation.
- Antenna capable of simplex and repeater operation over a 1 mile area.
- Amateur license


