Introduction

Scenario

Purpose

The purpose of this drill is to exercise the Citizen Corps' ability to assess specific areas in the City and report their findings to the local ICP.

Introduction

Objectives

1. Establish DOC and Incident Command Post at Monta Vista ARK.
2. Exercise resource and message net concepts and procedures.
3. Test the Citizen Corps assessment procedures by using the EOC/DOC and ICP Action Planning process, operations deployment of teams and reporting Situation Status.
4. Exercise Comm Van to DOC information handoffs.
5. Manage information using OES documentation procedures and tracking methods.
6. Establish Command Post and safely conduct operations.
7. MRC medical support for rehab and wellness check.

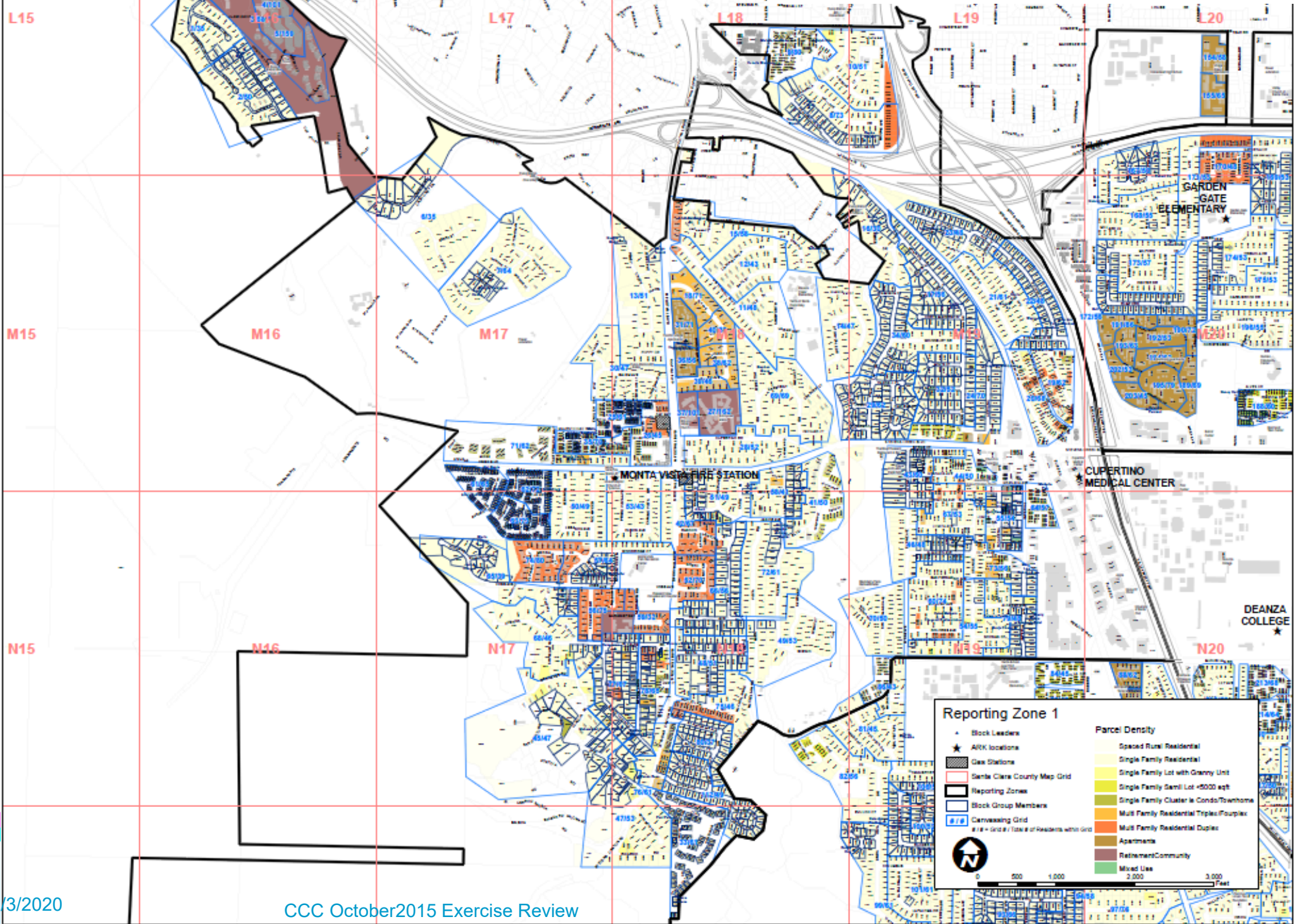


Survey Team Paperwork

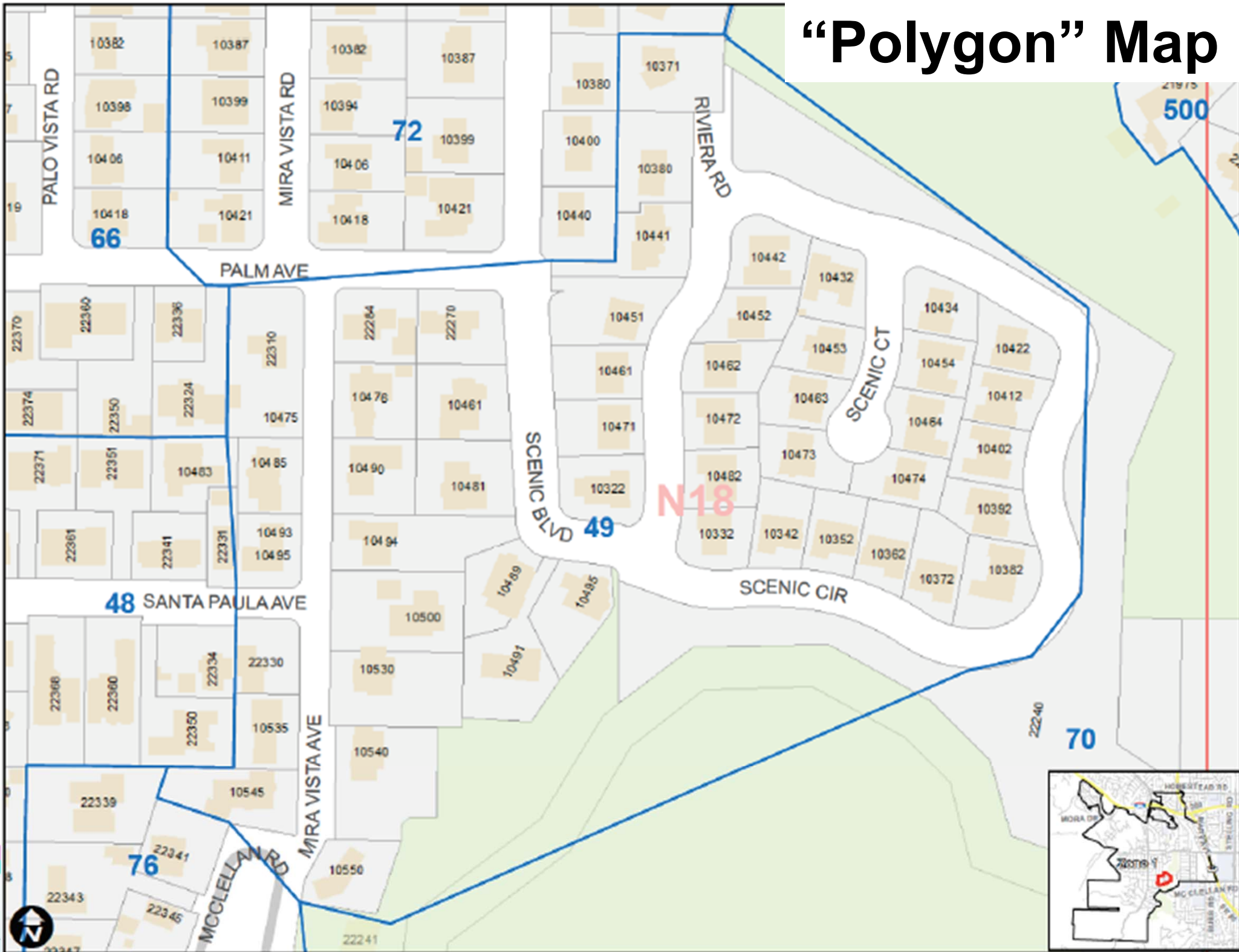
1. Polygon Map – a small area within an AKK Zone showing location of property parcels, streets, and street numbers.

Survey Team Roles and Responsibilities

1. Each team will be made up of 2 or 3 members, preferably 1 CERT, 1 CARES. Optionally, it may include an SUV.
2. Team Activities
 - Get Canvassing assignment
 - Drive to Area
 - Walk/Drive each street viewing the houses
 - Record features seen on each home
 - Fill in Report form for each Street
 - Report in to Status and Mapping
 - Get permission to continue or return to Ark
 - Safety Monitor



Survey Team Roles and Responsibilities

3. Team elements by task:

- Driver – Transportation to Assignment and Back to ARK, Safely
- Communicator – report results, answer health and welfare checks
- Search Participant – Make observation of each house seen
- Scribe – records what features seen by participants
- Quality Control – Verification of counts
- Safety – Every Team Member

- Everyone will have a buddy

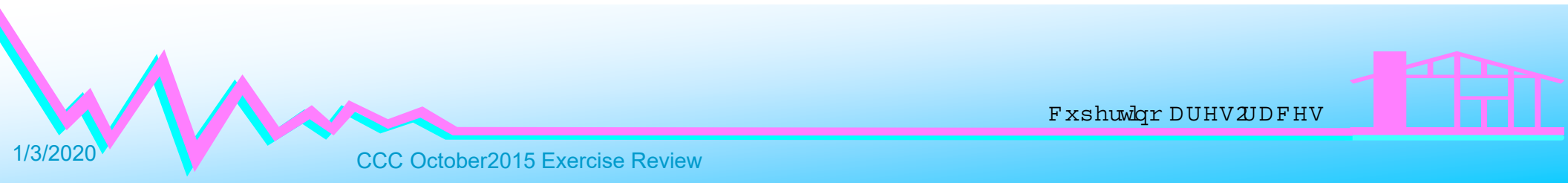
How:
