### What is Field Day?

- An annual ARRL sponsored 24-hour event held on the fourth full weekend of June
- Field Day Objectives
  - To setup communication operations "under abnormal situations in less than optimal conditions."
  - To work as many stations as possible in Region 2 and beyond
  - Demonstrate to the public what amateur radio service is about and how it can serve them in times of crisis and disasters
  - Public showing of how CARES prepares and serves our community

### CARES Field Day & COVID-19

- COVID-19 has changed nearly every aspect of life for the past 2 years but....
- Field Day 2022 will operate at a physical location:
  - Memorial Park parking lot on Alvis Ave. just west of the Quinlan Community Center
- Any COVID-19 requirements will still be followed

#### Rule changes for Field Day 2022:

- 1) For Field Day 2022, Class D stations may work all other Field Day stations, including other Class D stations, for points.
- 2) In addition, for 2022, an aggregate club score will be published, which will be the sum of all individual entries indicating a specific club (similar to the aggregate score totals used in ARRL affiliated club competitions).

#### New for Field Day 2022

2022 CARES Field Day

 3) All Field Day class stations NOT to exceed 100 watts PEP.

#### How do the rules affect CARES Field Day?

- The first rule allows any home station operating as class D (home station) to work all Field Day stations including other class D home stations
  - In previous years, class D stations could work class A, B, C, E and F but not any class D stations
  - This waiver allows for more contacts to be made
- The transmit power of 100 watts PEP is new for 2022 and means an even playing field for all stations leaving it to band conditions and propagation as the great equalizer

## If you choose to operate from home but want to contribute you're points to CARES Field Day:

- Each participant operates from home, mobile, etc. and uses their own call sign
- Each participant will assume their own class and ARRL/RAC section
- Each participant logs their own contacts
- Each participant submits their own Field Day entry using the Field Day web submission form:
  - https://field-day.arrl.org/fdentry.php
  - Each participant enters "CUPERTINO ARES" on the web submission form field labeled "Club or group name"



#### **ARRL Class**

- Class A: Club or Group of 3 or more persons
- Class B: No more than two persons typically running on battery power or non-commercial power
- Class C: Mobile -- vehicle, marine mobile, aeronautical mobile
- Class D: Home station running on commercial main power
- Class E: Home station running on emergency power
- Class F: Emergency Operation Center (EOC) CARES operates in this class
- The number preceding the class designator is the number of transmitters operating simultaneously
  - Eg: 2F = 2 transmitters operating simultaneously as class F

#### **ARRL Section / RAC section**

- ARRL section is an abbreviation of the section (geographic region) you are operating from
- ARRL Sections in San Francisco Bay Area:
  - SF: San Francisco
  - EB: East Bay
  - SCV: Santa Clara Valley

#### CARES Field Day — Bands and Modes

#### What bands can be used for Field Day?

- All work bands
  - Includes: 160m, 80m, 40m, 20m, 15m, 10m, 6m, 2m, 70cm
  - Excludes: 60m, 30m, 17m and 12m
- Modes:
  - Digital
    - CW, PSK31, RTTY, FT8, FT4, Packet
  - Non-Digital
    - SSB phone, FM Voice

### **CARES Field Day Bands and Modes**

#### What types of contacts do NOT count for Field Day points?

- Any contacts made using repeaters
  - No contacts via FM repeaters, IRLP, Echolink, DMR
- Contacts made via Satellite are exempt


### **CARES Field Day Plan**

- CARES Call Sign: K6KP
- GOTA Station Call Sign: AG6GX
- Field Day Class and Section: 2F SCV
- ARRL Class F is EOC designation
- Cupertino EOC Activation Number: CUP-22-32T
- EOC activated and operating on 100% emergency power
- Location:
  - Quinlan Community Center rear west parking lot
    - 10185 N Stelling Rd, Cupertino

**NOTE**: No need to establish or maintain an ICS-214

### **CARES Field Day Plan**

- **Operating Stations** 
  - Two HF Stations
  - Bands: 40m, 20m, 15m, 10m
  - Modes: CW, SSB Phone, PSK31, FT8, FT4
- **GOTA HF station**
- VHF/UHF Station in Com Van 469

Modes: FM Voice, Packet

### **CARES Field Day Equipment**

- One Tri-band HF beam antenna: 20m, 15, 10m
  - One 30-foot vehicle-based push-up mast with guy lines
  - One Triplexer for multiple stations on tri-band antenna
- One Buddy pole antenna for 40m NVIS communications
- Cupertino Com Van 469



### **CARES Field Day Equipment**

- Several runs of coax
- 7 KW generator from Com Van 469, power strips, extension cords
- Fire extinguishers from ARKs
- 4 canopies, 8 tables, 13 chairs
- Information table with CARES literature and public sign-in visitor's log
- Food and drinks provided by the EOC

### **CARES Field Day Schedule**

- 8:00 Volunteers arrive for setup
- 8:15 Site planning, safety briefing, assignments
- 8:30 Site setup (canopies, antennas, Com Van, radios)
- 10:30 Site and safety walk-through checks
- 10:40 Field Day operation and safety briefing
- 11:00 (1800 Zulu) ARRL Field Day radio operations begin
- 12:30 Lunch arrives
- 16:00 17:00 Disassemble site, return equipment

- Greet and welcome the public, answer questions
- Media Interviews
- Visits by Cupertino elected officials and served agencies
- Visit by ARRL section leaders

You will often hear "Please copy...class section"

Use of phonetics are very important especially on HF SSB

#### HF band Plan depending on propagation

Time PDT	Band	Mode	Remarks
1100	20m	CW, FT8,SSB	This is the most popular band
1200	20m	CW, FT8,SSB	
1300	20m	CW, FT8,SSB	Check both 15m and 10m, look for FT8 signals
1400	20m	CW, FT8,SSB	Check 15m
1500	20m	CW, FT8,SSB	Try the "take a nap band", there might be good propagation
1600	20m	CW, FT8,SSB	Check 40m, also 10m has been known to have short openings
1700	20m	CW, FT8,SSB	Check 40m
1800 - 2000	20m,40m	CW, FT8,SSB	Check 80m
2000 - 2300	20m,40m,80m	CW, FT8,SSB	20m usually dies at this point
2300 - 0600	40m,80m	CW, FT8,SSB	40m and 80m should be strong, or try the "Go to sleep" band
0600	20m, 40m	CW, FT8,SSB	
0700	20m,40m	CW, FT8,SSB	80m will start to die
0800	20m,40m	CW, FT8,SSB	
0900	20m	CW, FT8,SSB	Check 15m and 10m
1000	20m	CW, FT8,SSB

### **CARES Field Day Volunteer Needs**

Volunteers needed for setup and teardown

- Listen for and copy down W1AW bulletin (K6PH will broadcast the W1AW bulletin for the West Coast)
- Station operators
- Man the information table and take public sign-in

### What to bring to Field Day

- Communications Vest
- CERT hard hat and gloves for setup and teardown
- CARES Badge
- Sturdy shoes
- Hat for shading your head and face
- HT
- For Fox Hunt
  - 2m HT with good signal strength meter
  - Removable whip antenna or a Yagi
  - A cardboard tube wrapped in aluminum foil long enough to slide the whip antenna into



#### Field Day 2022 is over, Now What?

- Follow up on visitors log for those who expressed an interest in Citizen Corps
- ARRL Field Day Submission
  - Calculate bonus points and QSO score
  - Put together all supporting documents
  - Submit scoring sheet and supporting documentation to the ARRL within 30 days
- After Action Report for city EOC activation
  - Write AAR and submit within 90 days



### **CARES Field Day Entry Submission**

#### After Field Day, if you worked Field Day from home:

- Collect any supporting documents to support any claimed bonus points
- 2. Total up your contacts by band and by mode
- 3. Package up your logs (hopefully they are on your computer)
- 4. Go to <a href="https://field-day.arrl.org/fdentry.php">https://field-day.arrl.org/fdentry.php</a>
- Enter YOUR call sign, your location in the ARRL/RAC section drop-down list
- 6. On the form "Club or group name", enter "CUPERTINO ARES"
- 7. Enter the number of participants and simultaneous transmitters
- 8. Check the class you operated as: B, C, D, or E
- 9. Check the Power Sources, all that apply



### **CARES Field Day Entry Submission**

#### After Field Day, if you worked Field Day from home:

- 9. For bonus points, only check the ones you did i.e., copy the W1AW bulletin and attach any supporting documents/files
- 10. Enter your QSO counts by band and mode per the table in the form
- 11. Do not enter anything for GOTA
- 12. Double check your information
- 13. Provide your name, call sign and email to confirm
- 14. If all is correct, click Submit Entry
- 15. Add any further comments as you wish
- 16. You will receive an email with your total score and breakdown. The email will contain a link for making changes if necessary.

Entries must be submitted with in 30 days of Field Day RACES

#### **Some Final Comments**

- All FCC Part 97 rules apply during Field Day
  - At Memorial Park, K6KP trustee and GOTA station coach AG6GX both hold an Extra class license
  - Station operators may work with Extra class privileges
  - If operating from home, your license class and band privileges are in affect
- If there is an active hurricane, please stay clear of 14.300MHz and 14.325MHz
  - Marine Mobile Nets
  - National Hurricane Center
- Setup and Teardown
  - Work with the equipment owners and follow their instructions
