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| 3N        | National Notification Network  |
| AAR       | After Action Report; a document intended to capture observations of an exercise and make recommendations for post-exercise improvements. The final AAR and Improvement Plan (IP) are printed and distributed jointly as a single AAR/IP following an exercise.   |
| AFN       | Access and Functional Needs; refers to individuals who are or have: physical, developmental or intellectual disabilities; chronic conditions or injuries; limited English proficiency.   |
| ARES      | Amateur Radio Emergency Service  |
| ARK       | City-owned shipping containers located throughout the city that are stocked with emergency supplies to support a field-based ICS field response. ARK is staffed by Citizen Corps.  |
| ARP       | Alternative Response Plan; provides a written guide to City officials, City OES, and PSC vehicle staff on the minimum information needed to activate the PSC Alternate Response Plan, and to describe this response.   |
| ARRL      | American Radio Relay League  |
| Base Camp | CAL FIRE, synonymous for the ICP   |
| CAL Fire  | The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) is an emergency response and resource protection department. CAL FIRE protects lives, property and natural resources from fire; responds to emergencies of all types, and protects and preserves timberlands, wildlands, and urban forests. |
| CAP       | Corrective Action Plan; FEMA; HSEEP: actions identified during activations or exercises that are tracked to completion, ensuring that exercises yield tangible preparedness improvements.  |
| CARES     | Cupertino Amateur Radio Emergency Service  |
| CCC       | Cupertino Citizen Corps  |
| CCNS      | Cupertino Community Notification System  |
| CERT      | Community Emergency Response Team  |

| EOP             | Emergency Operations Plan. The document that describes the methods, procedures, and authority for coordinating resources and personnel of a jurisdiction in responding to disasters.  |
| ExPlan          | Exercise Plan. This document; provides the instructions, guidelines and organizational information to all participants for the conduct of a specific exercise.  |
| FCC             | Federal Communication Commission  |
| FEMA            | Federal Emergency Management Agency   |
| FLA             | First Look Area   |
| FLA Control Log | The document used to record the assignment, completion, and results of assigned FLA area  |
| FSE             | Full Scale Exercise. An exercise is as close to the real thing as possible. It is a lengthy exercise which takes place on location using, as much as possible, the equipment and personnel that would be called upon in a real event.   |
| GIS             | Geographic Information System   |
| H & W           | Health & Welfare; used within the context of a Health & Welfare Check. Usually check of field teams to sure they are OK.  |
| HCP             | Health Care Professionals   |
| IAP             | Incident Action Plan  |
| ICP             | Incident Command Post. A temporary physical location used for the purpose of on-scene incident command and management at the tactical level.  |
| ICS             | Incident Command System. A people management system with clearly defined roles and functions, and with attributes or system features that are flexible and adaptable to both large and small incidents and events.  |

| PSA     | Preliminary Safety Assessment, a home-based assessment that develops a quick snapshot of the state of the city based on the distribution of CARES members   |
| PSC     | Public Safety Communications  |
| PSPS    | Public Safety Power Shutoff   |
| RACES   | Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services  |
| RO      | Radio Officer   |
| RRO     | Radio Room Operator. The position that originates and receives messages for exchange with field responders  |

| SOP     | Standard Operating Procedures   |
| Staging | CAL FIRE: Reporting locations when resources deploy to the fire. For big incidents, each division is likely to have a staging location. Resources go there to await assignment; supplies are dropped off there. |
